1.0 Welcome

The Secretary welcomed those present and briefly explained the purpose of the meeting and the background to the issue with deer in Kishorn before handing over to The Chair.

The Chair asked those present to provide a brief introduction to include how they are involved with deer in the community and what their concerns are.

2.0 Issues Raised

The discussions that followed covered a range of matters and various issues including the following:

- Lyme Disease: incidence may be increasing although this may partly be due to greater awareness; range of hot spots across Scotland, including Uists; recent cases included family members and child in Kishorn; blood tests from deer collected for NHS England research.
- **Ticks**: prevalence of ticks in local area; identified that deer culled recently on enclosed crofting common grazings had fewer ticks than those culled in local woodland; decline in ticks may be due to either decline in sheep on crofts and/or effectiveness of treatment on existing sheep.
- **Fencing**: extent of deer fences from Tornapress to Reraig; recent repairs undertaken by Glen Mhor Estate; recent installation of fence and cattle grid by Mike and Susan Tweats; possibility of enclosing residential properties, and/or extending fence at Seafield.
- Current Position with Deer: Two sub-populations of predominantly stags; Kishorn population supplemented by possible from Applecross across Seafield; Achintraid population resident in birch woods on common grazings; deer continuing to enter gardens causing private damage; some culling undertaken at Ardoch and Achintraid; no culling unertaken in and around Kishorn; no winter feeding undertaken but stalker presence continues to be strong.
- **Current Actions**: Lochcarron Estate culled stags in Achintraid and Ardoch culled stags between Achintraid and Kishorn in Summer 2018 with further culling planned for both areas.
- Deer Vehicle Collisions: no recent deer vehicle collisions reported.
